HEAD OF BFA PERFORMANCE PROGRAM, University of Michigan, 2016-2022. Executed the following duties:

- Oversaw the trajectory of all the approximately 96 BFA performance majors (roughly 80 acting majors and 16 directing majors).
- Oversaw the reconceptualization of the acting curriculum, first in 2016, and then again in 2020, and subsequently oversaw the implementation of those new curriculum. The 2016 revision reconsidered pedagogical philosophy and curricular sequence, and the 2020 revision considered equity and inclusivity efforts. Communicated these curricular changes to the SMTD curriculum committee to solicit approval. Created a document describing/outlining the curriculum.
- Made changes to Silent Advisor (curriculum guide for students) as necessary and communicated those with appropriate SMTD advisor.
- Oversaw/led all the roughly 11 BFA Performance faculty (the exact number of Performance faculty differs year-to-year, plus or minus 1).
- Mentored junior performance faculty on their tenure stream and evaluated their promotion dossiers and submitted evaluation to the SMTD administration.
- Organized and communicated teaching assignments for BFA Performance faculty. Assigned class times and sorted out room assignments.
- Oversaw (with Chair) the hiring of Performance area adjunct, visiting, and temporary replacement faculty.
- Conducted interviews with finalists for the Chair of Theatre and Drama, Voice and Speech, and Directing faculty finalists, and submitted a report to the Dean, Chair, and Search Committee, to contribute to the search and hiring process.
- Scheduled Performance area meetings, initiated and solicited faculty for agenda items. Sent out agenda in advance and led meetings. Generally, about one meeting a month.
- Set up and had regular meetings with Chair. Generally, every other week. Joined Chair in meetings with SMTD Dean, when pertaining to Performance area matters.
- Served on Chair's Departmental Advisory Committee and attended monthly committee meetings.
- Oversaw and solicited changes to BFA area policies/protocols and communicated those changes to Department Administrative Associate to be written into the departmental Policy Book.
- Attended annual departmental kickoff meeting, introduced Performance faculty, met separately with first year acting majors in break out meeting to discuss Student Handbook, area policies, etc.
- Prompted BFA students to select Student Reps. Met with Student Reps once or twice a semester.
- Arranged sophomore evaluation date and worked with Foundation Advisor (academic advisor for first-and second-year actors) to organization the evaluation. Met with all sophomore actors after their evaluation to discuss their progress.
- Provided program audition dates to Performance faculty and solicited their participation.
- Conducted info sessions/Q&A for parents and prospective students on BFA program audition/interview days. Ran the audition room on those days.

- Collected all Audition Evaluation Forms from faculty and delivered them to SMTD admissions. Arranged meeting for Performance faculty to make admissions decisions. Met with SMTD admissions to go over and finalize admissions decisions.
- Recruited admitted performance students, reaching out via phone, email, and in-person and zoom meetings. Assigned current students for outreach to admitted students (welcome emails, lunches when prospective students are visiting, etc.). Helped arrange campus visits for admitted students.

NOTE: Under my leadership, the matriculation rate for the BFA Performance program went from 50% to roughly 65%. BIPOC representation in our BFA Performance program went from roughly 10-15% to roughly 40-45%.

- Helped create documents and a brochure that highlighted the success of recent graduates of the Performance program, to help promote the program.
- Updated and kept tabs on student casting history. Help guide casting considerations for each semester's faculty/guest artist directed plays based on that history.
- Oversaw and implemented the reconsideration of the Departmental audition and casting policies.
- Helped assign scholarships for in-coming first year BFA students with Chair and SMTD admissions. Organized meeting for scholarship assessment/ranking for students already enrolled and then worked with Chair to assign scholarships for those students.
- Solicited grades from directors for Performance Practicum Studio I and Studio II classes (credit for performing in or assistant directing a mainstage show) and recorded those grades.
- Reviewed and signed all forms for students needing approval for leave of absences, curricular substitutions, and other administrative requests.
- Met with every class of performance majors at the beginning of the year to go back over area/department policies and to discuss expectations for the year.
- Helped initiate/organize/produce the senior acting showcases in NY, LA, and Chicago.

NOTE: When I arrived at Michigan the acting program hosted a "capstone" experience in which a half dozen industry professionals were brought to campus to work with the graduating acting majors. I initiated and organized an industry showcase in place of the capstone. The showcase performs in LA, NYC, and Chicago. To adjust to the pandemic, I helped organize and execute a digital showcase, which has remained part of the showcase "package" for the graduating actors. Additionally helped in the effort to advocate for funding for the showcase, both from SMTD revenue streams and through private giving.

- Helped in the effort to conceive and implement COVID-necessitated social distancing adjustments to every aspect of departmental classes, performances, and business.
- Helped organize and program Performance Area "Forum"; bringing in prominent guest artists (Ex: Wendell Pierce, Aaron Posner, Chris Jones); helped organize forum panels, including on "Culturally Conscious Casting and Theater" and on "Intimacy and Consent in Theater Practices."
- Served on the student-faculty Accountability Committee. The committee keeps active all efforts around equity and inclusion.
- Attended and assisted in some SMTD/Theatre and Drama development events.

NOTE: I was on sabbatical in 2021-22. During that year, though not on campus, I was co-Head of Performance, sharing the duties with a colleague. Over the year we realized, given the size of the area, the area was better served having a larger administrative leadership structure. We received approval for a three-person structure (Head of Performance and sub heads in Acting and Directing) from the department Chair. In 2022-23 I was on an unpaid leave of absence to perform in the Broadway production of Tom Stoppard's *Leopoldstadt* and had no teaching or administrative responsibilities. During that time, my colleague stepped fully into the Head of Performance position. Upon my return in the Fall of 2023, she has remained in that position, and I have stepped into the Head of Acting position.

PRODUCING ARTISTIC DIRECTOR, UV Theater Project, Chicago and New York, 2014-present:

- I am co-founder and Producing Artistic Director of the UV Theater Project, a small NFP 501(c)3 theater organization. We produced annual summer site-specific/unconventionally staged productions of canonical plays from 2015-2018. Other projects and the pandemic paused our activity, though we began work again in 2022 and most recently produced, *Rock Medea*, my rock n roll adaptation of *Medea*. **The UV Theater Project's mission is to build bridges between old and new forms, between cultures, and between generations of artists.**
- My responsibilities as Producing Artistic Director include selecting plays, receiving rights, assembling cast and team, hiring a pay master, working with Actors' Equity on contracts and scheduling, creating budgets, raising funds (through grants, ticket sales, crowd sourcing, and private donation), sending out tax documentation when needed, publicizing the productions, articulating the mission and aesthetic emphasis, directing and acting, among other various duties.
